Helen's Flower, Sneezeweed

Masses of blooms supply seemingly endless sizzling flowers from mid to late summer in the sunny border. Compact, well-branched foliage grows to **18-20"** tall. Trim in early June to promote branching and a larger display of blooms. Prefers average, well-drained soil. Bred by Arie Blom of the Netherlands.

Willowleaf Sunflower

If you're looking for deer-resistance and the quintessential **golden yellow** fall color right up until a hard frost, this selection hits the jackpot! The narrow leaves and dark green foliage form a shrub-like mound before bursting into bloom in September and continuing into November. Grows **24-26"** tall. PP#30117.

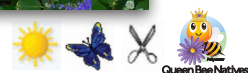
'Lemon Queen'

Lemon Queen Sunflower

This tall and stately perennial sunflower will reach **5-8'** high and blooms in July-September. Single layered **lemon yellow** flowers are **2"** across, offering masses of simple daisies. It is drought tolerant and low maintenance for naturalistic gardens.

Plant **24"** apart.

False Sunflower

This native provides a never-ending supply of **golden-yellow** semi-double long-stemmed daisies that resemble small sunflowers, above glossy deep green foliage. Great for cutting and attracting butterflies and other pollinators. We have chosen it for its more compact growth habit at **3-4'** than other Heliopsis.

'Bleeding Hearts'

False Sunflower / Smooth ox-eye

Conservative gardeners should go ahead and take a chance on this exciting new seed selection! These ox-eye flowers start out deep **red**, transform to **orange-red** and fade to rustic **yellow** and bronze. From June to October blooms are quite eye-catching against the **3-4'** tall dark plum-purple. Prefers moist, well-drained soil.

Plant **24"** apart.

False Sunflower

Come one, come all...butterflies and other pollinators hear the call. Contrasting **golden yellow** flowers with a large **red** eye sit atop plum-purple stems from mid-summer into fall. This showy native selection is tolerant of many soils types and grows **3-4'** tall.

Lenten Rose

Known as one of the earliest flowering perennials in our area, the Lenten Rose's blooms appear on **18"** stems in very early spring and persist for up to 8 weeks. The large flowers range from **cream** to **plum** with a hint of **green**. Given rich, well-drained soil and shade, it will self-sow, creating a colony of plants with handsome evergreen leaves. An excellent choice for a deer resistant ground cover. **Plant 18"** apart.

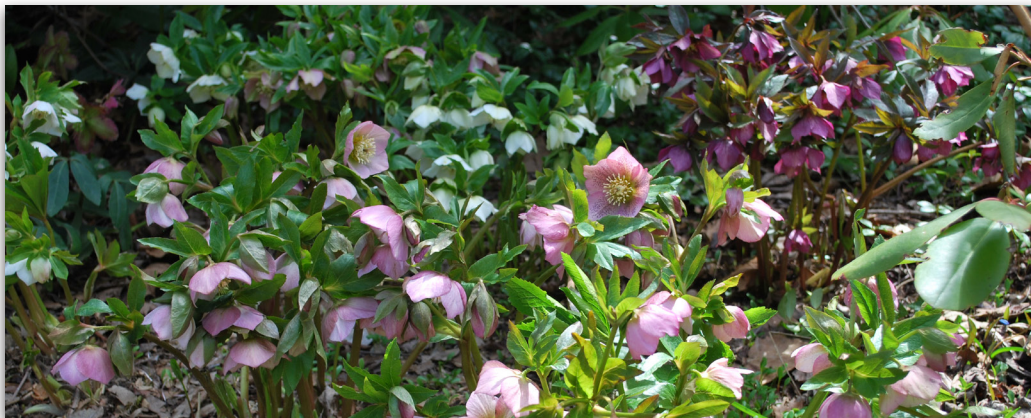
Lenten Rose

This is a wonderful introduction from long time hellebore breeder, David Culp. The flower colors will vary from **white, yellow, pink, burgundy and purple** to nearly **black** on single, semi-double and double blooms. It blooms in early spring with nice evergreen foliage and grows to **18"** in height. **Plant 18"** apart.

Lenten Rose

This hybrid blooms six weeks or more starting in late winter with saucer shaped flowers that range from **reds** to **maroons, yellows** and pale **greens** to **white**, often lightly mottled with maroon. The evergreen foliage has a leathery texture growing **18-24"**. Lenten Rose prefers moist, but well drained soil with plenty of organic matter. **Plant 18"** apart.

Lenten Rose

Welcome sights in February after a long cold winter are the burgundy buds and **dusty pink** to whitish blooms that mature to a rosy red and continue to bloom into April. Imagine the deep green silvery brushed foliage and the burgundy stems and buds emerging **12-15"** above a snow dusted garden. Spring is around the corner! PP#21063 **Plant 18"** apart.

Lenten Rose

This hybrid has attractive blue-green evergreen foliage that grows **12-18"** tall. Blooms appear in late winter to early spring, opening from from rose-pink buds to outward-facing **ivory** blooms that develop a tinge of **rose-pink** and **chartreuse** as they age. Combine with shade tolerant groundcovers such as Ajuga, Lamium and Phlox stolonifera. PP#16199 **Plant 18"** apart.

Anna's Red

Lenten Rose

New foliage emerges bronze-green with hot pink veins and deep purple buds and reddish-purple flowers are held on dark red stems in late winter. Leaves age to dark green with cream marbling and outward-facing blooms continue profusely into spring. Grows 18-24" tall and wide. PP#24720

Lenten Rose

This Frostkiss® has lavender-pink blushed and creamy white flowers that are exceptionally long blooming from mid-January to early April. The robust foliage has dark green leaves with silvery veins and grows 18" tall by 30" wide. PP#27120

Dorothy's Dawn®

Lenten Rose

This exceptional late blooming Hellebore has foliage that begins the season with a pink tinge and transforms to lighter green with a silver overlay. Pale pink and cream outward-facing flowers are long lasting from February to April. Grows 12-20" tall and wide. Plant with spring blooming bulbs and Ferns. PP#28010

Lenten Rose

Heavily silver-veined dark green foliage and dark stems hold pure white flowers from February to April. The outward-facing blooms are a beauty to behold in the early spring garden as winter slowly fades. Clumps grow 24" tall by 24" wide. PP#25685

Moondance™

Lenten Rose

Dark green foliage with silver veins is topped with white flowers that have a chartreuse center and age to pale green. Grows 24" tall. Exceptionally long blooming from February to April, Frostkiss® Hellebores emerge from the cold and often snow covered ground to welcome spring and continue a show of lasting deer-resistant color for weeks. PP#27969

Lenten Rose

Penny blooms a delightful mauve pink from late winter to mid-spring, but that's not all! The spring foliage starts out bronze-green with deep pink veins and purple stems and is especially nice against the early purple flower buds. As the season progresses the veins become bright green, complimenting the long-lasting pink flowers. 18-24" tall. PP#24149

These vigorous growers are bred from Christmas Roses for their winter blooms, Snow Roses for their robust habit and Lenten Roses for their variety of colors. Outward-facing blooms appear in winter and bloom for several weeks atop dark green glossy foliage. Height is 13-24". Plant 24" apart.

This phenomenal collection of Helleborus orientalis hybrid singles and doubles have large 3-4" diameter downward facing flowers. All profuse bloomers in remarkable colors, they have been hand-bred by one of the world's best Helleborus hybridizers, Marietta O' Byrne. The jewels of the winter garden, Hellebores are tough, hardy and deer resistant. Sturdy, dark green, evergreen foliage fills the garden even when not in bloom.

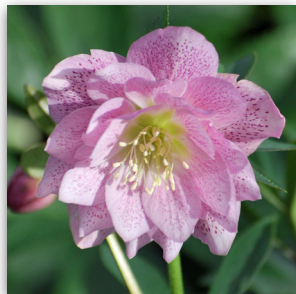

Daylily

An outstanding ever blooming daylily with 3" ruffled apricot flowers. Petals appear to be diamond dusted making them shimmer in the garden. This stunning display starts in late May and continues until fall with a succession of 24" tall stems each bearing 9-10 buds. Pairs well with Perovskia or Nepeta. PP# 13223.

Daylily

Delicately pale pink and cream with a throat of glowing chartreuse, 'Catherine Woodbury' works well with other pastel shades, grows to 30", blooming in June and July. Combine with Eragrostis spectabilis, Leucanthemum 'Becky', and Achillea 'Oertel's Rose'.

Hemerocallis 'Chicago Apache'

Daylily

A hardy, vigorous grower, this rich scarlet red Daylily shows up well in the landscape when it blooms in June and July at a height of 27". Place in the sunny border with Leucanthemum 'Snow Lady', Schizachyrium 'Standing Ovation', and Agastache Kudos™ Yellow.

Daylily

The mid to late summer blooms of this award-winning variety are buttery yellow with a prominent maroon eye that is notched at the mid-rib. Red picotee edges that run half way up the petals and the chartreuse throat add to the appeal. Quite vigorous and hardy. Grows 28" tall.

Long blooming from summer to fall with fragrant flowers that stay open into the next morning. Alternating lighter and darker lavender-pink petals have a contrasting yellow throat. Grows 28-36" tall.

The fulva is the Daylily we most often see at woodland's edge or along the side of the road. Its clear orange flowers appear on 3-4' stems in July and it thrives in sun or semi-shade. This daylily will pair well with Summer Phlox.

Rick Watson is proud to introduce this beautiful cultivar. Named after his wife Gail, this fragrant daylily has large light yellow flowers with curved ruffled edges. Flowers are fade resistant with a very long blooming season from June until October. Height 22", Bloom Size 4.5". A heavenly fragrant daylily, it is delicate but sturdy and a long lasting continuous rebloomer. One of the longest blooming daylilies!

Another old-fashioned favorite, 'Hyperion' has very large, **canary yellow** flowers that reach 40" or so in July and August. Graceful and charming, its lovely fragrance is a delightful bonus. Known as a great cut flower. Try with Achillea 'Strawberry Seduction' and 'Salvia 'Caramia'.

This dwarf variety produces loads of deep **purple** blooms in early to mid-summer. Flowers have tightly ruffled petals and a neon green throat. Overall height is 18". 'Little Grapette' will combine well with Sedum 'John Creech' and Salvia 'Snow Hill'.

Daylily

Considered one of the best, if not THE best, **near-white** Daylily, 'Joan Senior' is a multiple award winner. It has 6" lightly ruffled flowers in June and July at 25" and it is considered a rebloomer. Place in the sunny border with Monarda 'Balmy Rose', Echinacea 'Butterfly Kisses' and Allium 'Millenium'.

Daylily

Vigorous, fragrant, **creamy white** flowers are 4" in diameter with a large **cranberry-purple** eye. It blooms in early to midsummer and is a repeat bloomer. Widely adaptable to various growing conditions, it will grow 20-24" tall. Use with Dianthus 'Burgundy Blush', Monarda 'Raspberry Wine' and Bouteloua 'Blonde Ambition'.

Daylily

A deep, **burgundy-red** rebloomer with a chartreuse throat, this multiple prize-winner starts blooming in June and continues off and on into the fall. Considered a miniature due to its small bloom size (2 3/4"), it reaches a height of 18". Try with Sedum sieboldii, Rudbeckia fulgida var. fulgida and Salvia 'Blue Hill'.

AKA 'Razzmatazz', which says it all! Starting in June, the 2.5" **purple-rose** flowers with ruffled petals, yellow throats and dark purple veins, jazz up the garden. Reblooming occurs off and on atop 16" stalks until late summer.

Another re-blooming daylily to add to your collection, this one has a wonderful **rose-pink flower** with a darker **rose-purple eye** and a vibrant yellow throat. 'Rosy Returns' grows **14-16"** tall and is a repeat bloomer from June to frost. Try with Echinacea 'PowWow Wild Berry', Platycodon 'Astra Pink' and Veronica 'Whitewater'. PP#9779.

This multiple award winner is perhaps the most popular Daylily of all time, and is definitely our most popular variety. Bright **golden yellow** flowers begin in June and keep it up until late summer on **12"** stems. Use it in borders, on a bank, in containers on a patio or deck, or make a Daylily bed of 'Stella de Oro' by itself. Try it with Salvia 'Blue Hill' for a stunning color combination.

Pink blooms have a **deep rose red eye zone** and clean deep green foliage. A beautiful pink rebloomer, this multiple prizewinner is **26"** tall, with **4"** blooms, starts flowering in June and July, and does so off and on well into fall. Try with Agastache 'Blue Fortune', Leucanthemum 'Becky' or Panicum 'Heavy Metal'.

The **dusky rose-pink flower** has a chartreuse throat with sturdy stems, along with vigorous foliage, which is wider than that on many Daylilies. It blooms mid-season in June-July reaching about **24"**. Combine with Achillea 'Oertel's Rose' and Salvia 'Rose Marvel' for a long blooming rose-pink display.

'Dale's Strain'**

Has unique silvery blue mottled over green leaves with darker purple veining growing **15-18"** tall. You really need to buy it for its foliage, but it does bloom in the spring with **white** flowers. It is a seed propagated strain selected by Dale Hendricks, thus the name Dale's Strain.

'Green Spice'**

Coral Bells

This will spice up your garden with foliage of green, a silvery overlay, darker green edges and burgundy veins. Blooms of **creamy white** in late spring to early summer stand above the **8-10"** mound. In the fall, 'Green Spice' has an added bonus the leaves turn pumpkin orange.

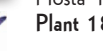

'Palace Purple' has it all—beautiful showy **white** flowers on wiry purple stems at **18-24"**, and purple-bronze broad leaves with a pink underside. Flowers appear in June. The foliage color holds best in partial shade. Plant them in the border in clumps, as edging, or in nooks in the rock garden. While complementary perennial combinations are endless for 'Palace Purple', try it with the silvery blue leaves of Hosta 'Halcyon', and any of our Siberian Iris.

'Berry Smoothie'
 Coral Bells
 Representing the rose-purple spectrum, spring foliage of rose-pink darkens to a cool and refreshing deep berry-rose with purplish veining. Spreading out to 20" and growing to 18" tall, the heat-tolerant foliage has white coral bells in mid-summer. Pretty exciting with Dicentra 'Gold Heart' and Euphorbia 'Ascot Rainbow'. PP #21871.

'Berry Timeless'
 Coral Bells
 Dr. Alan Armitage reminds us that Heuchera were originally bred for the cut flower market and this new variety takes us back to the good old days with its gorgeous blooms. Light pink flowers are combined with aged rose-red blooms on the stiff 18" scapes from early summer to frost. Mounding 8-10" tall mint-green foliage gives gardeners a two for one performance. PP#26357

 Coral Bells
 One of our most popular Heucheras, 'Caramel' is a vigorous grower with very good heat and humidity tolerance. It has golden caramel leaves with purplish undersides. Foliage grows to about 10" and white flowers appear in early to mid summer. Try with Brilliance Autumn Fern, Anemone 'Whirlwind' and Carex 'Everillo'. PP#16560. **Plant 12" apart.**

 The ruffled peachy orange leaves of 'Peach Parfait' are as whimsical as the fete! This H. villosa hybrid performs well in summer heat and will produce an attractive mound of colorful peach foliage with darker reddish-orange veins. Grows 10-12" tall with small white flower wands in summer. PP#24928

 Coral Bells
 What do green apples, Fresca bottles, and fishing lures have in common? They would go unnoticed next to Heuchera 'Citronelle'. Spikes of white flowers float above the 12" tall bright chartreuse foliage in summer. A refreshing selection, this H. villosa hybrid is quite heat tolerant. Requires a little more shade than other Heuchera. PP#17934. **Plant 12" apart.**

 Foliage color is not the only attribute of this Heuchera! Remarkably long blooming creamy yellow flower spikes compliment the caramel to bronze-red leaves from May to October. A mere 9" tall with spikes makes this a perfect choice for a combination container or front of the shady border. PP#24564

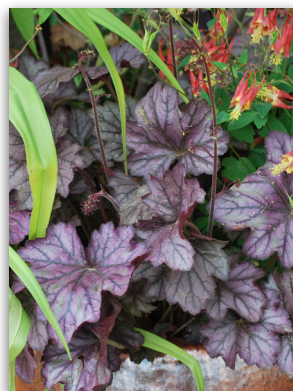

 New leaves of peachy-rose change to white-washed peachy-gold as they age. The combination of leaf colors looks spectacular in spring! Peachy-pink flowers appear on maroon stems in May and throughout the summer. Just peachy! Grows 11-14" tall. PP#27567

 Richness of foliage color will make this new Terra Nova introduction a standout in the garden. Glossy deep purple leaves form a ruffled mound 12" tall by 20" wide and look stunning next to the golden leaf Dicentra and Japanese Painted Fern. Purplish-pink flowers appear on short stems in summer. PP#26358

Slightly ruffled deep red leaves have the most intense color in the cool temperatures of spring and fall. **White** flowers on 14" spikes stand out against the red foliage in mid-summer. Compact foliage grows 7" tall. Try with Lady in Red Fern and Brunnera 'Jack Frost'. PP#29644

The rich glossy foliage transforms from reddish-purple to rose-tinted pewter creating an attractive mound 10" tall and 15" wide. Complimentary **white** bells dangle on 18" scapes above the foliage in summer.

Lime is the choice to add a bright spot in the shade garden. Ruffled lime-green foliage with the appearance of loose-leaf lettuce is larger than 'Citronelle' and performs well in heat and humidity. The foliage grows 10" tall and **white** flowers appear on 16" tall spikes in spring. PP#21861

This conversation starter in the world of Heuchera has hot pink speckles on purplish-black leaves that become lighter pink as the summer progresses. 10-12" tall mounded foliage can be placed in full sun in the north but requires afternoon shade in the south. **White** flowers appear in early summer. PP#18551
Plant 15" apart.

Heuchera x 'Peach Flambe'

Coral Bells

When this Heuchera comes up in the spring, it has bright peachy color foliage that becomes more reddish bronze as the season progresses and peachy plum for autumn. It has a mounding habit with **white** flowers in the springtime. Grows 8-10" tall. Use with Acorus 'Variegatus', Aster divaricatus or Galium. PP#17195.

Heuchera x 'Plum Pudding'

The shiniest dark plum-purple foliage of this popular Heuchera has faint silver marbling and is deeply ruffled and tight. **Pale pink** flower clusters appear in June and July at 18". Try it with a yellow-leaved Hosta such as 'August Moon', or as a contrast for silver or brightly variegated perennials such as Pulmonaria 'Opal', Variegated Carex or Liriope, Lamiums, or Japanese Painted Ferns.

Metallic silvery leaves have deep wine-red scalloped borders, veins, and underside. The overall effect is a rich burgundy glow. Trim and tidy, 'Silver Scrolls' at 12-18" is a vigorous grower with **creamy white** June flowers from pink buds. Evergreen by nature, it will respond to seasonal light levels with rich purple foliage color in winter and more silvery overlays in spring. PP#12066.
Plant 18" apart.

Vibrant **rose-pink** flowers bloom from early summer to fall on **16-20"** scapes above 8-10" mounded foliage. Try with Anemone 'Pocahontas', Astilbe 'Vision in White' and Hakonechloa 'All Gold'. PP#31987

Large 5 – 6" leaves are saturated with deep purple color offering a striking contrast to greens and yellows in containers or borders. Foliage color lasts for most of the season and makes a complimentary backdrop to the tall dark flowering stems with **white** flowers and **rose-pink** calyxes. Grows **10-14"** tall. PP#31222.
